Cecil would strategically plan to rest and water his horse at the Ruck place. It was during one such rest stop, where Cecil was enjoying the great food and hospitality offered by the Ruck family, that Cecil met Lydia. Being a noted marksman himself, Cecil admired Lydia's ability to shoot a rifle. She would pride herself at being able to shoot a coyote in the head at 100 yards. They were married on November 5, 1943.
